NYPD depends on Mesk for protection

Jamaica equipment store supplies NY's Finest with everything but guns, badges

Kenneth Epstein cares about getting his customers the right fit more than most merchants. He can tell what size you wear by looking at you, but he will measure you personally regardless. And if your custom-made purchase does not fit when it arrives, he will send it back so it can be remade from scratch.

That's because Epstein's customers are New York City police officers, and if their bullet-resistant vests do not fit, it could mean the difference between life and death for one of the city's Finest.

"It's more than just a store," said Epstein, who founded Mesk Police Equipment nearly 35 years ago on 168th Street in Jamaica, across from the 103rd Precinct. "I have to sleep at night. I have to make sure these guys go out safe."

The kevlar-plated vests are only the most critical of a wide range of equipment for police and private security Epstein sells from his second-floor store. Short of department-issued firearms and radios, his store has just about anything an officer on the street is wearing or carrying: shoes, hats, slacks, shirts, gloves, holsters, handcuffs, flashlights, belts, night sticks and collar insignia.

The nature of his business presents a concern other store owners never have to think of.

"There are a lot of arrests that get made in here for people impersonating police officers." he said.

Customers buying police equipment need to show police identification, and those buying private security gear must prove

that they are licensed by New York State. When a 62-year-old man came in last year posing as an NYPD lieutenant, Epstein noticed that the man's ID was modified. He asked the man to wait, went to the back of his store and called the police, who collared the suspect in his store.

He also helped identify Reginald Gousse, a Springfield Gardens man convicted of impersonating a cop and killing a Long Island banker two years ago. Gousse was in Epstein's store around the time of the killing.

"He wanted to buy a custom-made holster for the gun that he killed the guy with," Epstein said. When he heard about the killing, Epstein checked and learned that the type of gun Gousse had was not used by police. He got suspicious and tipped off investigators. Today, his office wall is adorned with letters from the Queens and Nassau district attorneys thanking him for his help.

Epstein's commitment to his customers' safety is paramount. In the late 1990s, when a manufacturer recalled thousands of bullet-resistant vests, he remeasured every officer he sold one to — at his own expense.

"There were a bunch of vests that were not up to par," he said. "I remeasured 6,000 people."

To Epstein, cutting corners to save money is not an option.

"You can't just be a businessman," he said. "You have to be a human being first."
